FROM OUR CO-SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

"Oh, if I just had more time." Have you ever uttered these words to yourself? Perhaps when you're running late to work or when the weekend has flown right by. Maybe you've said these words at the end of a visit with your loved ones. Or when you have too many things to do and so little time!

I don't know what it is, but it seems that every fall, I find myself running on the treadmill of life. It's such a busy time of year with children returning to school. Last-minute family reunions, fall festivals, and sporting events crowd my calendar, and I find myself struggling to keep up and keep the main thing, "The Main Thing." Perhaps you struggle with this same problem.

The ancient Greeks had two words for time—Chronos and Kairos. They are two sides of the same coin, but they are as different as heads and tails. Chronos is clock time, where we get the word chronology. Chronos is sequentialit is divided into time frames of past, present, and future. Chronos is also quantitative, meaning it counts seconds, minutes, and hours. So, managing Chrono's time is incredibly important because our calendars will control us if we don't control our time. But I'd have to say that Chronos isn't as important as "redeeming our time," which is where Kairos enters the equation.

Kairos makes the most of every opportunity. It's the sixth sense that perceives the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Kairos is all about taking the time to stop and smell the roses or pause and notice a beautiful sunset. It's about listening to the water as we wash our hands or notice the joy in a child's laughter or the peace on their face when they fall asleep. Kairos is more about enjoying the journey and less about reaching a particular destination. Kairos is about seeing God within everyday life and who God is calling us to become. Indeed, God is the creator of time. God named night and day and divided time into weeks, months, and years. But God doesn't exist within our dimensions of space and time. God is omnipresent, which means that God is here, there, and everywhere God is present yesterday, today, and tomorrow. As a result, God doesn't measure time the same way we do. God desires for us to follow God's lead and measure life not in minutes but in moments of time.

God desires for us to keep the main thing, "The Main Thing" by finding God in everyday life events.

Matthew 6:33 reminds us "[to] seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness." This scripture comes with a promise that if we put God first in our lives, "all these things will be added to you." What things are promised to us? Everything we need will be provided to us: Food, water, shelter, and clothes. However, we also receive God's comfort, peace of mind, and joy when we seek God. So, slow down and spend time with God during this busy season, Friends. Only then will we be truly satisfied.
